

What is privacy?

Privacy is the power to reveal yourself selectively - to choose what parts of your life others see and what stays private. Without privacy, your autonomy disappears, leaving you vulnerable to control and manipulation. Surveillance is not just watching; it's a form of power that restricts freedom and shapes behavior.




Surveillance Capitalism

Surveillance Capitalism

Tech giants like Google, Meta, and Amazon aren't just offering services - they're extracting behavioral surplus: data about your actions, preferences, and even intentions. This data isn't freely given - it's mined silently as you move, search, and scroll. The more they know about you, the more precisely they can predict and shape what you do next - not just to serve, but to sell, influence, and control.

Take Back Control

- Use Librewolf instead of Chrome or Firefox (de-googled, hardened)
- Prefer XMPP or Matrix over WhatsApp and Telegram
- Switch to Tutanota or ProtonMail for email
- Turn off location history and personalized ad tracking
- Use Linux. Seriously it's your digital home, not theirs.

Take Back Control

What it is: Encryption turns readable information (plaintext) into unreadable data (ciphertext). It's math that protects your messages.

Why it matters: Only the sender and intended recipient can read the content. No one else - not your ISP, not Big Tech, not governments.

How to do it: Use GPG (GNU Privacy Guard), a free and open-source encryption tool that lets you encrypt files, emails, and verify identity.

GPG powers secure communication for developers, journalists, and activists. It's how you protect your ideas, your identity, and your freedom.

What is a GLUG?


A **GNU/Linux Users' Group (GLUG)** is a community dedicated to promoting and supporting *Swatantra (Free/Libre) Software.*
